It is now two years since I became your local MP and I am pleased to publish my second annual report.



STEVE ELECTED TO POWERFUL COMMITTEE

I have been elected to a powerful House of Commons committee during the past year and now sit on the Justice Select Committee, chaired by experienced Lib Dem MP Sir Alan Beith, following an election among MPs just before Christmas.

My work on the JSC took me to Copenhagen and Norway recently as part of our big ongoing inquiry into youth justice. This is an agenda I care about a great deal; we should steer troubled youngsters away from the criminal justice system, with its appalling rate of reoffending, and save taxpayers billions in the long run. My work on the committee is fascinating and our inquiries into Freedom of Information, as well as youth justice, will no doubt receive wide media coverage this year.

Along with dozens of other coalition MPs, I have lobbied the Chancellor hard this year to make good our pledge to increase the personal tax allowance.

The move on income tax in the Budget of Spring 2012 lifts some of the poorest people I represent out of tax altogether. This is not only fair and just, but a crucial way to generate growth as it puts money in people's pockets. We are now tantalisingly close to that £10,000 threshold and on course to get there well before 2015 as we promised.

From 1st April 2012 you can now earn £8,105 before you pay a penny of tax and £9,205 from April 2013.

MP LEADS NEW SCHOOL CAMPAIGN

One of my biggest campaigns this past year has been (and continues to be) the urgent need for a new primary school in Winchester.

My post-bag, my surgery and the number of temporary classrooms that are having to come online for September 2012 tell us there is a real problem in the city and Hampshire County Council must act so we can accommodate future Reception Year children and maintain the excellent standard of schooling we enjoy at the moment.

The response to our campaign has been extremely positive with a full consultation being launched in April that could help. I addressed a big public meeting at Westgate School in May (pictured bottom right) on the issue and I am urging all parents, future parents and members of the local education community to have their say.
