

COMMUNITIES UNDER THREAT

STEVE BRINE has warned that community life across Chandler's Ford is under threat as never before.

The Prospective MP's warning comes as plans to replace local family doctors' surgeries with impersonal super-surgeries known as 'polyclinics' were criticised by the British Medical Association and the Patients Association.

Meanwhile, local nurseries are campaigning against the scrapping of top-up fees for nursery education, which could close many desperately needed places in the area.

While many of our sub-post offices survived a cull this year we lost a branch in Bournemouth Road and there are worrying noises from Government of more cuts to come.

Meanwhile, Eastleigh Borough Council is pressing ahead in the face of mounting public protest with plans to scrap travel tokens relied heavily upon by many local residents.

Counting the cost:

- 1,700 family doctors' surgeries could be replaced by 'polyclinics'
- 1,000's of nursery places under threat
- 2,500 Post Office branches set to close
- Popular travel tokens face axe
- Continued concern over local bin collection

Steve Brine told The Chandler's Ford Post: "We are fortunate to live in a vibrant community here but we are facing a real

threat. Just look at what happened to post offices this year when we saw profitable businesses closed against the wishes of local people. And now, the intention to meddle with nursery education is leaving parents and nursery staff with an uncertain future.

"Local NHS services could be next. Patients and GPs in the constituency have spoken to me and they are fearful that local family doctors' surgeries could be replaced. Who wants to travel miles to a 'polyclinic' and never see the same doctor twice?

"The cumulative effect of losing these services is that communities become weaker and it is the poorest, the elderly and the most disadvantaged who suffer the most. We've got to reverse this trend of cut backs and closures and I am determined to argue just that if I become this area's next MP."

A plan for positive change in Chandler's Ford

Steve Brine, the local Parliamentary Candidate, has welcomed the plans unveiled at the Conservative Party Conference, which will help residents across Chandler's Ford, Hiltingbury and North Millers Dale.

The Conservative leader David Cameron said the conference showed that his party is a strong, united alternative to Labour. But he insisted that the Tories were not just sitting back and waiting for Labour to fall apart: 'We're coming forward with bold, radical ideas for changing Britain,' he said. 'There is absolutely no complacency.'

During the week, the Conservatives unveiled a clear plan for change. Among the key announcements were:

● The plan for a strong economy - helping ease the pain of the downturn and improving our economy for the long term. David Cameron pledged to make sure government lives within its means, cuts the national debt, and makes Britain more competitive.

- The plan for a better NHS getting rid of Labour's top-down targets and bureaucracy, and making sure doctors answer to patients, not politicians.
- The plan for social reform starting to repair our broken society by raising school standards and discipline, ending the something-for-nothing welfare culture, and strengthening families.

Steve said this is great news for local families: "Because we're a united team focused on the big issues we face, I hope people can trust us to work together for the country in a crisis. I think it is also important to remember only the Conservatives can remove this Government from office."

'We're talking about the future of this country, unlike Labour who spent their conference arguing about their internal problems and the Liberal Democrats who were either attacking us or making wildly irresponsible (not to mention unaffordable!) promises of tax cuts."

DIG FOR...FOOD!

So much has been said in recent years about the threat to allotment sites in the Eastleigh Borough it would be easy to think the problem has gone away. It most certainly has not!

Thousands of residents have signed petitions, there have been visits by Shadow Ministers and vocal protests outside the offices of Liberal Democrat controlled Eastleigh Borough Council.

In spite of this, and even after the loss of Monks Way and South Street for new development sites, council eyes are focusing in on the next target - Woodside Avenue. Up until 2003 this site was fully occupied and well tended by over 120 dedicated plot holders. Since that time, Eastleigh Borough Council has sought to run the site down by refusing to let plots to newcomers as and when they became vacant. This letting ban has continued in spite of significant demand for allotments and a waiting list of around 300 people.

Once again the Eastleigh and District Allotments Association is standing up for local people.

Prospective Chandler's Ford MP, Steve Brine says; "Our only specific allotment site in Chandler's Ford is "Ramalley" just off the Hursley Road and I know how valued it is by users."

"I want us to move away from repeated attempts by the Borough Council to build on allotment sites and make a statement as a country that they are not luxury items - they are an essential part of our communities. In these times of soaring food bills and huge demand for organic local produce we should be opening more allotments not closing the ones we have. We should also be supporting local schools who I know are increasingly keen to let their

students experience the joy of producing their own fruit and veg."

Steve has undertaken to raise the issue with his colleagues in the Shadow Cabinet and is arguing for allotments to become protected sites in each community - over and above enjoying 'statutory' site status - so they can more easily resist the greedy eyes of developers and local councils.

THE FUTURE OF ADULT CARE

Hampshire's ageing population presents our area - and Hampshire County Council especially - with one of its biggest challenges.

County Councillor for Chandler's Ford, Colin Davidovitz says; "Put simply, we had two choices, bury our head in the sand or give people and organisations across the county the opportunity to give their views and opinions on the future services for adults in need of support and care."

The Conservative-led authority has set up the Commission of Enquiry on the Future of Adult Social Care which has been holding public hearings - in Winchester - during much of 2008.

The driving force behind this move is a Government wish to provide adult social care that is more personalised. The so-called Personalisation Agenda will be a fundamental change to the way social care services for adults are being delivered and it is expected that it will

bring about much better outcomes for people in need and their carers and will ensure that they are afforded choice, dignity and control in the way they lead their lives.

Prospective MP Steve Brine is backing the enquiry 100 per cent - it will report to Government later this year. "I attended an excellent session with the BBC's Peter White at our very own Discovery Centre in September and have discussed the challenges posed to Hampshire by the soaring cost of Adult Social Care with Colin Davidovitz and HCC Leader Cllr Ken Thornber on several occasions (pictured). That has allowed me to influence the debate and communicate experiences given to me by local people on this most important of subjects."
