READY FOR CHANGE

Yes! But Chandler's Ford must vote for it says Steve Brine

The environment, Britain's economic crisis and the NHS were right at the top of the agenda for Chandler's Ford Prospective Conservative MP at this year's Party Conference in Manchester.

Local family man Steve Brine spoke in the main health debate and made a passionate defence of the Royal Hampshire County Hospital. "I didn't move here to become the local MP", Steve told *The Chandler's Ford Post*. "This is my home and the place Susie and I want to bring up our family. Emily was born at the RHCH in 2007 and was at the front of my mind as I addressed conference on the importance of maternity services and A&E to the future of District General Hospitals."

As widely reported, George Osborne outlined specific measures to start tackling the country's damaging debt crisis. Steve says; "As I watched the Shadow Chancellor make clear, we are all in this together and we all have to deal with the legacy of this Government if we are to put Britain back on her feet.

"I was particularly pleased to see the focus on protecting vital public sector jobs locally and Military personnel on active service overseas as well as details of our ambitious programme of apprenticeships to give young people locally real hope of sustainable long-term jobs for the future."



■ Steve Brine attended the Climate Clinic/Stop Climate Chaos reception and signed a pledge ahead of the crucial Copenhagen Summit in December 2009. He says; "This is an extremely important summit, we must ensure that a 'real deal' is done at Copenhagen.

An agreement can only be considered a success if it is capable of keeping warming below 2 degrees Celsius (the threshold for dangerous climate instability). The UK government should not be afraid to blow the whistle if a proposed deal will fall short of securing

The Headteacher of any school is vital to its success – and few places is that more true than at The Toynbee School in Chandler's Ford.

Matthew Longden arrived from Applemore College in Dibden Purlieu in January – within no time at all he had the Ofsted inspectors crawling all over the Bodycoats Road school. He needn't have worried; an upbeat assessment graded the school as "satisfactory" with "good" features.

You get the sense from Matthew Longden that he was not going to be satisfied

with... "satisfactory". He says; "The school has been through a period of real change, but has got massive potential. People looking at Toynbee now can see a school that is going places."

Fixing Traffic Problems in North Millers Dale

When local people complained about traffic problems in North Millers Dale the Liberal Democrat Council came up with a plan for a series of Humps, Bumps and Traffic Islands!

Conservatives however, came to the rescue with a common sense solution designed to help stop traffic from speeding through the estate and allow safer road crossings. Cllr Colin Davidovitz

said; "Local people told me they didn't want the 'Lib Dem humps' and I thought the money saved could be used to build safer road crossings in the estate road and a signalled crossing in Hursley Road. This would make it safer for North Millers Dale residents to cross the roads and to get to the schools, post office, recreation facilities and shops in Hiltingbury.

TOO CLOSE TO CALL

The next General Election in Chandler's Ford looks set to be close. Bookmakers Ladbrokes have local family man Steve Brine and the Liberal Democrats neck and neck, with both parties on odds of 5/6. Steve says; "The local Liberal Democrats seem to think this new constituency is already won but I don't think people here want to be taken for

granted. My message to local voters is – whatever the polls say, the next General Election will be much closer than many people think. Gordon Brown currently has a comfortable majority of seats in the Commons and it will take every possible Conservative vote to remove New Labour from Number 10.

Local Hospital praised at Conservative Conference

Prospective MP Steve Brine, spoke passionately in support of the local NHS when he addressed the Conservative conference in Manchester.

Speaking in the main health debate (pictured left) he said a strong District General Hospital in Winchester with obstetric-led maternity and consultant-led A&E and a large General Hospital in Southampton offering regional specialisms were the bedrock of the local health service.

He said; "David Cameron has pledged the NHS will be our number one priority in Government and it is my priority in the new Winchester & Chandler's Ford constituency. It's all about services available to local people and their sustainability in the long-term. I told the conference that we have good hospitals locally but I also reminded the Shadow Health team that rising costs, from nationally negotiated pay awards to the impact of the EU's Working Time Directive, were pushing local Trusts into difficult times".

Steve made clear that although he accepts change and reform in the service the focus must always

remain on services – not buildings or dogma – for the benefit of local people.

HILTINGBURY ROAD SCHOOL JUNCTION

Campaigners fear that children's lives are being put at risk on the junction of Hiltingbury Road and the road leading to the Hiltingbury Schools and Hiltingbury Recreation Ground.

Local campaigner Judith Grajewski (pictured) told The Chandler's Ford Post; "Children and parents walking to and from the schools using the crossing patrol are being placed in unnecessary danger by a few drivers who persist in turning right into Hiltingbury Road as they leave the school despite a clear 'no right turn' traffic sign advising that they should not do so between 8.30 – 9.00 a.m. and 3.20 – 4.00 p.m."

"Recent improvements at this junction have seen double yellow lines to prevent parking in the side road and traffic



calming measures to slow down drivers yet a few people continue to create a needless hazard to pedestrians."

Prospective local MP Steve Brine added; "The crossing patrol man does a fantastic job on this road,

busy in both directions, but has the added problem of vehicles turning right into his path from behind as they leave the schools. Action is needed now so that drivers get the message - NO RIGHT TURN MEANS NO RIGHT TURN!"

New residents at Abbotswood (800 dwellings proposed) and Great Covert, North Baddesley (1050 dwelling proposed) will be passing through Hiltingbury to get to the M3 motorway unless steps are taken to create the necessary infrastructure to provide an alternative route.
