## My Year at a Glance

**JUNE** – Re-elected at the 2017 General Election with over 50% of the vote once again. Appointed Public Health Minister with responsibility for cancer policy. Locally, supported the Winchester Business Excellence Awards and launched a new city Car Club sharing scheme.

**JULY** - Lobbied SSE after Alresford suffered a series of power cuts and welcomed a boost for local schools with the increased education budget. Visited Micheldever and Wonston fetes, Party in the Park in Stanmore as well as the induction of Rev Julia Myles in Alresford. Brought good news with Discretionary Rate Relief for local businesses and saw traffic problems for myself in Wonston.

**AUGUST** - Opened a new play area in Oliver's Battery and worked cross-party with Cllr Jamie Scott to save the Common Room at The Valley. Took the family to the brilliant Graze Festival in Twyford and was featured by Sue Hughes in Winchester Resident Magazine.

**SEPTEMBER** – Confirmed the future of the Royal Voluntary Service at the RHCH and welcomed Twyford and Sparsholt school children to Parliament. Met with Seaward Properties to discuss the Sun Lane development in Alresford, the Friends of St Cross, CPRE and Brendoncare. Joined our student society at Fresher's Fair, attended the Littleton Show and Hiltigbury Extravaganza in addition to opening the new Dovetail Centre Café in Chandler's Ford.

**OCTOBER** – Welcomed SSE making good on their promise to Alresford following July's power cuts to the benefit of Alresford PIGS. Spoke out against the RMT strikes inconveniencing local commuters, and examined flood resistance plans for Littleton and The Worthys. Welcomed news that the number of local council homes is to double, visited Winchester Bereavement Support and Ageas in Chandler's Ford.

**NOVEMBER** – Regret there will be no new Critical Treatment Hospital to the north of the constituency but welcomed plans for an adult hospice at the RHCH. Laid a wreath on behalf of constituents for Remembrance Sunday and met children from Twyford School, South Wonston Primary and Itchen Abbas in Westminster. Defied the cyber bullies to open a new Basics Bank in Stanmore!

**DECEMBER** - Findlay Robertson from Chandler's Ford won my annual Christmas card competition as I caught up with the team at the cathedral Christmas Market. Visited Hiltigbury Junior and Infant schools, held a Q&A at St Faiths School and hosted Peter Symonds students in Parliament. Took part in a special Churches Together Prayer Breakfast at the Guildhall.

**JANUARY** - Backed plans for new almshouses at St Johns, visited Abbeyfield in Twyford, Hobbs Rehabilitation in Martyr Worthy, Southampton General and held a high level rail meeting following SWR's poor start to their franchise. Also welcomed Conservative plans for kerbside glass collection, hosted Harestock children in Parliament and welcomed majority of plans for the new Junction 9.

**FEBRUARY** - Spoke with all key players, including the Environment Agency, over the Bakkavor planning application in Alresford and backed government plans to reform the energy market. Invited local nominations for the NHS@70 Awards competition and spoke at the annual City Business Breakfast.

**MARCH** - Brought the new Education Secretary, Damian Hinds, to Peter Symonds College, and met with local College Principals in Parliament about future funding. Welcomed news on the NHS pay rise for local workers and held a snowy street surgery in Alresford.

**APRIL** – Teamed up with #finalstrawwinchester aiming to end single use plastic straws, opened the new club-room at St Cross Grange Care Home and visited Winchester College. Backed a cycle to school campaign at Merdon Primary in Chandler's Ford, held a Q&A with 6th form students at St Swithun's School and brought the Premier League trophy to Weeke Primary School.

**MAY** – Welcomed local election outcome in Winchester which keeps the City Council Conservative run and in Chandler's Ford where three Conservatives were returned. Took a Bike to Brekkie for Christian Aid Week and took the family to the Alresford Watercross Festival as well as the St Paul's Community Fun Day.

## GREEN Winchester


There is no question that an environmental revolution is taking place as we act on our promise to be the greenest government ever.
