CITY DEAL JOBS BOOST

Steve Brine has given his backing to a new City Deal in Hampshire following news that local authorities and business groups will see thousands of new jobs created in Southampton and Portsmouth.

The deal will provide £953 million of

investment into the area, creating more than 17,000 jobs.

Steve Brine said: "This announcement came off the back of the sad news about Portsmouth shipyard back in the autumn. Winchester & Chandler's Ford is in no way immune to the economies of Portsmouth and Southampton, and with that in mind I welcome the City Deal."

The deal between the Government and local businesses - and leaders from Southampton, Portsmouth and Hampshire councils and the Solent Local Enterprise Partnership - is the latest City Deal to get the green light from government. The Southampton and Portsmouth agreement will ensure local residents can access jobs in growing sectors and that local businesses are able to grow.



Health Check Survey 2014

Steve Brine launched a major survey about the local NHS to mark the start of 2014.

The MP for Chandler's Ford produced his Health Check Survey which covers general health policy, hospital as well as primary care and asks for views about the future of hospital services in our area. It is being delivered to every home in Steve's constituency.

Steve told The Chandler's Ford Post; "The survey is already producing impressive returns. As you

know, I am a passionate supporter of the NHS but we should be honest in saying it is far from perfect, locally as well as nationally, and I think we will need to change things sooner or later to make it a worldclass public service for the long-term that delivers better outcomes when we fall ill.

"The clinicians have come forward with plans for major change so we must hear their rationale and have the opportunity to be fully informed as the future of stroke, emergency and especially maternity

DIRECT DEBIT RIP-OFF

A new campaign is gathering momentum against energy companies who charge customers high admin fees for NOT paying their bills by direct debit.

Backing colleague Robert Halfon MP who started the campaign, Steve Brine said: "The poorest and most vulnerable customers can be ripped off by energy companies when it comes to paying for essential services such as gas and electric. I am supporting Rob's campaign because I do think it is unreasonable to penalize people who don't, for many different reasons, pay by direct debit."

TERM-TIME HOLIDAYS

Steve Brine called for more discretion to be restored to headteachers over granting term-time holidays.



Speaking after a recent debate in Parliament, which he contributed to, Steve said: "A 2006 Act came into effect in September last year allowing heads to only grant leave during 'exceptional' circumstances.

Beforehand, heads had discretion to allow 10 days authorised absence and I don't think we should be questioning their integrity or judgement in this way." **Look at parents' views via**

PRISONER VOTING

A special joint committee of Parliament has been charged with scrutinising the Government's draft Bill on prisoners' voting rights and local MP Steve Brine was a member.

When the committee report was published, the Committee was split, with the majority recommending that prisoners serving custodial sentences of 12 months or less, plus all prisoners in the last 6 months before release, should be able to vote in local, general and European elections. Our MP was among those on the committee in voting AGAINST these proposals. He said: "Personally, I think we should uphold the current ban and the House of Commons has every right to do so. Parliament needs to consider the extent to which we are content to permit the European Court of Human Rights to encroach into domestic policy areas that appear far removed from the original intention of the European Convention on Human Rights."

Steve Brine has given his strong backing to news that the UK is to opt out of planned European Commission rules on legal highs.

Steve has long campaigned against legal highs, and as a parent of two small children, welcomes news

that the government has decided not to join the scheme, due to the fact it would hamper British attempts to ban new drugs coming onto the UK market. Currently, the government is conducting a review into new psychoactive substances, while looking at a range of options, including possibly legislation, to deal with the dangers many of these substances present even more speedily and effectively.

Steve said: "This is a smart move in my view. One key part of our strategy to tackle this menace is the ability to move fast and ban new dangerous products before they can do harm. Sadly, European rules in this area do exactly the opposite so we have to sidestep the bureaucracy and protect people. Far from diminishing our ability to fight psychoactive substances this enhances it."

THE BILL ISN'T DEAD, IT'S JUST SLEEPING

A Conservative Bill to put into law that an in/out EU referendum must be held in 2017 was scuppered in the House of Lords recently by Opposition Peers who do not wish to give us a say on our membership.

Steve Brine, who has long campaigned for the referendum, said: "It was so frustrating to see a collection of Liberal Democrats and Labour Peers conspire to defeat the Bill and I am sure my constituents will draw their own conclusions as to why. However, it is now clearer than ever that it is only the Conservatives in the House of Commons who will guarantee that referendum, and if David Cameron is Prime Minister following the General Election, we will have just that."



SUPPORTING RAIL PASSENGERS

Regular commuter Steve Brine continues to stick close to our train service

In November he held a lively public meeting with the South West Trains Managing Director and the following month he hosted Rail Minister, Stephen Hammond, to view the various works taking place at Winchester station and follow up on some key issues raised at the public meeting.

Mr Hammond was able to see for himself the work being done to introduce a new decked car park at the station and the footbridge being constructed as part of the 'Access for all' scheme. He was also able to join discussions Mr Brine is having with South West Trains around late night safety for travellers.

Steve says; "There is significant investment taking place in our local railway right now so it was important to have the Minister visit and check on progress. It was really useful also to brief him on my recent meeting with South West Trains and local rail users and for him to hear what looks like good news on our work to improve late night safety, especially for women, in and around the station."

FRYERN POST OFFICE

There is finally some good news for Chandler's Ford and Hiltingbury concerning the future of the Fryern Arcade Post Office on Winchester Road.



Steve was contacted by the Post Office just before Christmas, as they confirmed they are now consulting, with the sub-postmaster's agreement, to move the current branch to a new location at 6-7 Fryern Arcade. Steve Brine said: "This is very likely

to be part of a new retail operation at WH Smith and I think is welcome investment locally in the Post Office and in the Arcade."

THORNDEN STEPS

VS MOTORWAY NOISE The issue of surface noise from the M3 motorway – and its dreadful

The issue of surface noise from the M3 motorway – and its dreadful impact on my constituents in certain parts of Chandler's Ford – never goes away. Local MP Steve Brine writes for The CF Post.

Every couple of years (usually when someone is new to the area and trying to make a noise themselves!) we have a new 'campaign' and of course, a petition. When I became your MP in 2010 I said I would fight for a quieter surface but I also said I would level with you and deal in facts so I want to make three points;

Firstly, I have met with successive Roads' Ministers and Senior officials from the Highways Agency. The Agency, which has had to take its share of austerity, rightly treat the M3 among their 'assets' and have to get the best value they can from it which means mending not replacing wherever possible.

Secondly, when that asset (the M3 in our case) needs resurfacing HA will do so with a quieter surface but they do not

TWYFORD PLAYGROUP

Swift action from Winchester and Chandler's Ford MP Steve Brine has helped a flood-hit playgroup, which had been facing a long period of closure.

Following extensive flooding in the village of Twyford, including at the parish hall, the Twyford Playgroup was forced to close, and initial fears were that a quick relocation to the Pavilion at Hunters Park may not have been possible due to cumbersome Ofsted procedures.

Steve says; "I was told applications to re-register can take up to 26 weeks which was just unacceptable so I enlisted the personal help of Education Secretary Michael Gove and we cut through a fog of British bureaucracy to help local parents get back to work."
