

M3 NOISE SUCCESS



Chandler's Ford MP Steve Brine has secured major resurfacing work for the M3 motorway which he described as 'absolutely fantastic' news for thousands of his constituents.

New Roads Minister John Hayes has written to Mr Brine to confirm the Highways Agency will bring forward plans to lay a new quieter surface on the M3 between junctions 9 and 14. The work will be done during the period 2015-2017 and will encompass all three lanes and the hard shoulder.

The MP has campaigned to bring forward the resurfacing work since his election in 2010 and last year took local councillors, as well as representatives from Shepherds Down School in Compton, to meet the Minister at the Department for Transport in London. He has met no fewer than three roads ministers in the past four years to lobby on behalf of the area.

Steve Brine said: "We had been told the carriageway passing through Winchester and Chandler's Ford was unlikely to be resurfaced until 2020 at the earliest but I couldn't accept that because noise from the motorway is seriously impacting on people's lives in large parts of my constituency. The current situation is unbearable for residents in parts of Chandler's Ford.

"This work has been carefully agreed with the Highways Agency to build what is required maintenance of the carriageway into the urgent need to address noise pollution. It is absolutely fantastic news for thousands of my constituents and, while we should not be tricked into thinking road surface is the sole cause of motorway noise, the lower noise surfacing material will significantly help."

ASKtheNHS

Local MP Steve Brine has held two open meetings this year as part of his ASKtheNHS series.

The first event, in March, focused on a new what's being proposed and to give my clinical model being produced across the **Hampshire Hospitals Trust and proposals** for a new critical care centre. It would work alongside the RHCH in Winchester but treat the sickest 15% of patients.

The second meeting, held in September, was focused exclusively on obstetric care and maternity services. Steve told The Chandler's Ford Post; "As a responsible Member of Parliament I want us to have the fullest possible understanding of

constituents the chance to question it.

"My major health survey in the Spring showed a willingness on behalf of local people to hear more of these plans but the greatest anxiety remains around changes to maternity services, hence the second meeting. Many questions remain but I will continue to work with the Trust getting the facts in front of the local people; this is far too important for poorly informed scare stories."

Last December Steve Brine chaired a meeting (pictured above) involving local councillors, police and those running the centre after a spate of incidents.

Steve says; "The Police report a quiet Summer but we need to be vigilant as the Winter deepens and the dark nights lengthen. If you have any concerns about safety issues in and around the Rec, I want to hear from you."

1997. It has bred a resentment in England which my constituents have every right to feel.



IT'S YOUR MONEY AFTER ALL...

Local MP Steve Brine has backed Conservative plans to introduce TWO major tax cuts if the party is re-elected next year.

Returning hot-foot from the party conference in Birmingham (pictured) Steve told The Chandler's Ford Post he was 'thrilled' with a pledge to increase the tax-free personal allowance from £10,000 to £12,500.

He says; "One of the easiest votes I've cast in the House of Commons since 2010 was to raise the level to £10,000 but this further move is brilliant news which will take a million people out of paying income tax, and mean no one working 30 hours a week on the minimum wage would pay any income tax."



Steve also highlighted a new pledge to raise the higher rate threshold at which people pay the 40p tax rate to £50,000. It is currently £41,900. He adds; "This tax change will be so well received among my Winchester constituents; I look forward to voting for that one."

The House of Commons faced an emergency recall at the end of September to discuss the threat posed by ISIL in Syria and Iraq and Steve Brine was there. He met with the Attorney General to discuss the legal basis for air strikes and challenged the Prime Minister during the debate.

MORE THAN A COLD

Steve Brine is supporting a local mum trying to spread the word about winter illnesses in children.

Alison Sanson lives in Chandler's Ford with her husband Graham, daughter Fleur, and they have twin boys. Alison said: "Parents are often not told about the risk of winter viruses or given support to prevent them.

"Michael and Edward were six months old when they were first affected by bronchiolitis and were both admitted to hospital where they tested positive for Respiratory Synctial Virus."

Alison first went to the doctor because the twins had trouble breathing. She was told that there was nothing that she could do but wait and see whether they could cope on their own, and when the twins were eventually admitted to hospital a few days later, they were very poorly, needing oxygen and feeding tubes.

Alison continues: "The time that they were in hospital was very hard as was the period leading up to that. It was



almost a relief when they were admitted in to hospital as before that it felt like a waiting game."

Steve Brine said; "I want other parents to avoid winter illnesses including bronchiolitis and back 100% the More Than A Cold campaign. I will be hosting an event to raise awareness in Parliament this year as well."

CARERS SURGERY 2014



Steve Brine joined up with One Community in June to mark Carers Week and raise awareness of and celebrate the UK's 6.5 million carers.

The Chandler's Ford MP held a special carers surgery at Wells Place, for the fourth year running, where he was able to chat to a wide variety of people.

Lucy Sams, One Community Carers Centre Manager said; "Steve's presence on the day adds real value as it provides carers with the opportunity to discuss anything from personal matters close to their heart, as well as general and local issues that make life more challenging."

Steve Brine adds; "Once again, I was delighted to be able to come along, meet some constituents, and find out more about the issues carers face. I was able to pick up some important casework, and it was great to see so many faces, new and old, at this fantastic event."

SCHOOLS MEET COPPA FEEL

A leading breast cancer campaigner came to the constituency earlier this summer to speak to young people in the city about the importance of the early detection of breast cancer and other cancers.

Local MP Steve Brine organised for 28-year old Kris Hallenga, who has a terminal diagnosis of secondary breast cancer, to bring her charity CoppaFeel to three secondary schools in Winchester, as well as linking up with the city's University to launch their #rethink cancer campaign which aims to see schools routinely teach young people about the signs and symptoms of cancer.

Steve Brine, who is co-chair of the All Party Breast Cancer Group in Parliament, said; "This day was more than any of us could have hoped for, especially the response from Joy Carter at the University. I hope the young people we met found it interesting and useful and if just one person, or a member of their family, is helped by what we are doing it will be worth it."
