CALL FOR SCHOOL

Momentum is gathering for a new primary school in Winchester.

Local MP Steve Brine has been leading calls for the new facility and is working with Conservative colleagues at both councils, as well as key members of the city's education community.

Steve told The Winchester Post all options remained on the table, including new provision from the Local Education Authority (LEA) and a new 'free' school.

Hampshire County Council recently announced they would consult on proposals for a new school in the city and Winchester City Council have now made provision for one in their draft local plan.

Steve Brine says; "It is very clear, regardless of what happens to Barton Farm, that Winchester has an increasing problem with primary places.

"The LEA has a fiendishly difficult job in many respects but my post bag, my surgery and the number of temporary classrooms that are having to come online for September 2012 tell us there's a crisis looming."

Steve, who is a parent of two himself, said it was good news the LEA recognise a new school is needed in Winchester but insisted a huge coordinated local effort was needed to avoid any further delay and get the new facility open for September 2013 latest.

He added: "I do however think there is a temptation to remain stuck in the old way of thinking whereby we wait patiently to see what the LEA gives us. Michael Gove's 'free' school policy is part of our localism agenda and for the first time it puts new school planning directly in the hands of Winchester residents.

"A free school in the city could be really exciting and I see no reason, least of all ideological opposition, why Winchester should be left behind."



Steve Brine has warmly welcomed the recent publication of the government's outline plans for our water, which recognise new scenarios of water availability by the 2050s.



NEW Local MP elected to Justice Select Committee

Winchester & Chandler's Ford MP Steve Brine has been elected to a powerful House of Commons committee. Mr Brine will now serve on the Justice Select Committee following an election among MPs, held just before Christmas.

The committee, which is chaired by experienced Lib Dem MP Sir Alan Beith, examines the expenditure, administration and policy of the Ministry of Justice, Attorney General's Office, the Treasury Solicitor's Department, the Crown Prosecution Service and the Serious Fraud Office.

The MP said: "I am really pleased to be joining the Justice Committee. It's a powerful check on the work of the MOJ and holds some key enquiries into Government policy, including most

recently the proposed abolition of the Youth Justice Board and the role of the Probation Service. I look forward to playing my part in its published schedule of work but also in helping to shape its focus going forward.

"I am very interested in the agenda around reducing re-offending rates, restorative justice and in the area of prison reform so I hope to use my new position to promote those causes within Parliament.

60-second interview



Award-winning author **Michael Dobbs** returns to *The Winchester Post* to put our local MP on the spot. Michael, who was made a Member of the House of Lords in 2010, is best known for writing the hugely successful political drama House of Cards and his writing on Winston Churchill.

The doom-mongers are predicting a terrible year ahead. Are they right?

It is going to be really tough yes. The Government must stick to its plan but there is no doubt unemployment and rising prices will continue to challenge us. The coalition is taking strong action to re-balance our economy but I will go on stressing the importance of hope and optimism alongside austerity in 2012.

This is the year Britain sees the world and the world sees Britain. As well as the London Olympic Games where Winchester and Kings Worthy will host part of the historic Torch Relay we also come together to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. The eyes of the world will be upon us



and this gives us an extraordinary opportunity to showcase our nation, despite these most difficult of times. Think Royal Wedding plus!

What do you see as the main challenges for Winchester? Winchester may have an unemployment rate below the national average but that is little consolation if you've lost your job. We have a large number of public sector workers in this city and our challenge, as in so many places, is to help the private sector grow and replace those jobs. We must also keep inflation under control and the economy stable; those of us with a mortgage to pay know all to well what even a half per-cent rise in interest rates would do to monthly bills so stability is key.

On a different, more local tack, I think we face a real challenge in planning for the new homes this area needs without ruining existing communities. Councillors, strengthened by our localism agenda, have a real job on their hands taking local people with them this year as their local plan comes into force.



It was an extraordinary busy year for you in 2011, your first full year as an MP. What were

your personal highlights? Generally speaking it was great to just settle into the groove of a being a good constituency MP and I have already helped so many people who came to me with their problems. It was good to see the Alternative Vote

resoundingly rejected by the British people in the referendum and personally, it was very nice to be elected, by my peers, to the influential Justice Select Committee in Parliament.

You are one of the hardest workers I know at Westminster. How difficult is it to juggle family and a full-time job in Westminster?

Very hard at times but I am no different to thousands of the people I represent. William is 14-months old now but we are having a terrible time with his sleeping so it's not easy to follow some of the very late nights Westminster demands with some very early mornings at home. I think we're all struggling to get the work-life balance right these days and I am no different.

Finally getting a chance to watch The Inbetweeners. What programme causes you to throw the remote control

at the TV? I don't watch it but if channel hopping and it comes on, Big Brother will do that to me.

Biting my nails; must do better in 2012 – especially when sitting behind the Prime Minister in the House of Commons as it drives my wife nuts!

What music is on your iPhone at the moment? Lots but I love 'Funny looking angels' by Smith & Borrows.

Your favourite meal - and who cooks it? Curry; cooked (and washed up) by anyone else!
