A VISION FOR WINCHESTER?

Growing unease as piecemeal change excludes residents and threatens local institutions.

Local MP, Steve Brine, has spoken out at what he called a lack of “joined up thinking” in Winchester as a series of major projects come to a head. Winchester City Council is juggling the future of the old River Park Leisure Centre site at the same time as Kings Walk is demanding new investment and the ‘Silver Hill’ regeneration scheme attempts (once again) to move forward.

Steve has, in recent weeks, called for a “pause for thought” on an exclusive deal WCC signed with Southampton University to explore the future use of the River Park site. Many residents have raised concerns about the lack of consultation before the decision was taken and that led to a successful legal challenge brought by the newly formed Friends of River Park.

Meanwhile, an explosion of support has greeted a campaign to keep the city’s skate park located at North Walls.

Steve says; “Winchester has got so much on its plate right now, recovering from the pandemic and attempting to make progress with Silver Hill which is, in itself, a growing concern for many as the council seem set to repeat the mistakes of the past and appoint a single developer for the site.”

He adds; “On River Park, clearly the site needs a plan - it’s an eyesore - but it should be one properly consulted on in a way which takes my constituents with it. More widely, I think many of us are increasingly concerned at how any of these major projects fit together – be that economic, cultural or educational – into a coherent vision for Winchester that doesn’t negatively impact existing institutions.”

“Time for WCC to pause for thought and be a lot more strategic.”

COST OF LIVING

Winchester MP, Steve Brine, has welcomed a multi-billion pound intervention by the Chancellor to help local families with the rising cost of living.

Steve says; “As the UK economy continues its recovery from the pandemic, we must confront the global inflationary pressures caused by the world economy coming swiftly back to life. Much of this inflation is being driven by the rising cost of energy due to increased demand worldwide – and that feeds through into pressures on the cost of living.

“Rishi Sunak has already taken steps; reducing the Universal Credit taper rate, increasing the National Living Wage, freezing fuel duty for the twelfth year in a row, and launching a £500 million Household Support Fund to help the lowest-income households with their bills. But now we can go further as the cost of living ‘checklist’ shows”.

PRIORITY NHS

POP-UP COVID JABS

A number of walk-in Covid vaccination centres have come online recently after an energetic campaign from local MP Steve Brine.

Pharmacy 2U have teamed up with the NHS on the Park & Ride site south of Winchester to add to the open access clinic at Badger Farm Community Centre with another hopefully to follow in Winchester City Centre. THE Prince of Wales may not have made it but a host of dignitaries were in Winchester last month to unveil the statue of an important medieval Jewish figure after a long campaign from local people.

Licoricia was a leading community figure in the 13th century who lived and died in the city. Her statue now sits outside the ARC (formerly the Discovery Centre) on Jewry Street.



SOUTH WESTERN RAILWAY

South Western Railway are returning train services to our area after announcing temporary cuts in January when Omicron hit.

Local MP, Steve Brine, took up the campaign after being contacted by a number of commuters living in villages including Micheldever and Shawford. Steve says; "These service reductions had real life impact and, for some parents, meant the difference between seeing their young children or not during the working week. I think we all, me included as a commuter myself, welcome SWR returning things to something more like normal, but we must stay vigilant."

Steve Brine has been at the heart of the committee's work as they investigate governance and racism at Yorkshire Cricket Club, hearing from Azeem Rafiq in a high-profile session at the end of last year. SIGN LANGUAGE BILL

A landmark new bill which seeks to make British Sign Language a legally recognised language in the UK is making its way through Parliament.

West Lancashire MP Rosie Cooper has brought forward Private Member's Bill, backed by Steve Brine, which has Government support, meaning it should become law. BSL becoming an official language will mean many deaf people will be able to access essential information and services in their first language.

NEW DOWN SYNDROME LAW STEPS FORWARD

A new law focused on people with Down Syndrome is being brought forward by Dr Liam Fox MP and it is being backed by our local MP.

The Private Member's Bill, campaigned for by Winchester's Tommy Jessop, seeks to ensure people with Down Syndrome will be legally recognised as a specific minority group. It will ensure councils and all public bodies are required to meet the specific needs of people with the condition.



ASK THE AIRPORT

Many residents, in particular those living South of Winchester, have great interest in the future of Southampton International Airport.

This May, local MP Steve Brine will hold a special ASKtheAIRPORT open meeting with the team from SIA. Representatives from ACOG, who are currently working on airspace changes across the UK, will also attend.

Steve says; "Following high profile decisions in recent years around the expansion of our local airport, there is no better time for this session. It will be a chance for constituents to raise their concerns with the people who make the decisions."

The meeting will take place on the evening of **Thursday 19th May** - location to be confirmed nearer the time.

HIGHWAYS & BYWAYS

Steve Brine has welcomed news that the M3 Junction 9 Improvement plan is still on track for a 2026 completion date.

Our local MP met with the team (pictured) behind the project, at National Highways Easton Lane depot, recently and told *The Winchester Post*;

"I really appreciated the update and know they're working flat out to get this project off the drawing board.

"I was glad to hear of the many changes they've made to fully integrate walking and cycling around the new layout as well as to accommodate legitimate concerns around access off the new junction towards Kings Worthy."

Steve also discussed integration with the paused 'smart' motorway programme on the M3 and pressed the team to redouble efforts with Hampshire to address the nearby Cart & Horses junction when work begins.



ASK THE MINISTER

This Spring will see a very special edition of Steve Brine's long running series of public meetings.

Constituents may remember various ASKtheNHS meetings, including one last year around the future of the RHCH in Winchester. Next he plans to hold an ASKtheMINISTER session with COP26 President, Alok Sharma.

Speaking about the event, which will take place on the evening of **Thursday 7th April**, Steve said; "Alok was front and centre of the COP global summit last year and is a great friend. This meeting will give people from across Winchester and Chandler's Ford the chance to put their climate and environment questions to the sitting COP President."

SMART MOTORWAY SUSPENSION

Steve Brine has welcomed a pause on the rollout of 'smart motorways' following a recent Transport Select Committee report.

The MP says; "This was the right decision as we need more safety data, but it's clear these roads don't have public support. We should stop their build, including here on the M3."

RURAL SPEED

A popular Winchester City Councillor has spoken out against speeding in Winchester's rural communities and villages.

Councillor Sue Cook, who represents Colden Common and Twyford, has welcomed a review of the Hampshire road's network which will not only look at speeding and safety, but also issues of air quality.

Sue, who is an active member of the local SpeedWatch told *The Winchester Post*; "I think many residents would agree with me that the status quo on our rural roads is far from ideal and it's only a matter of time until we see a serious incident. We are working closely with volunteers, Hampshire Police and both councils to tackle this issue."

ANDOVER ROAD



A parish councillor from Kings Worthy is listening to residents on the future of Andover Road with a major survey covering Weeke, Harestock, Kings Barton and Kings Worthy.

Signe Biddle (pictured) led the push to better understand public perception of the possible future closure of Andover Road to through traffic.

Current proposals are for Andover Road North to permanently close and

for traffic to be routed on Winchester Avenue through the Kings Barton estate. Some have raised concerns about safety, traffic flow, congestion, and the environmental impact on the diversion routes. Signe says; "The survey was very successful, receiving over 800 responses; a significant percentage of respondents were in favour the Andover Road North remaining fully open to traffic. It's now over to councillors to make up their mind."

SUPPORTING SCHOOLS

MP Steve Brine made supporting local schools one of his top priorities from the moment he was elected and one of his first energetic campaigns secured much needed new primary school places in Winchester.

He is a long-term supporter of the f40 campaign which sought to level-up education funding – to the benefit of rural counties including Hampshire where per pupil funding is traditionally below many urban areas.

Recently, Steve has quizzed Ministers on the recruitment of school support staff after being contacted by local Headteachers, including Steve Jones of Perins School in Alresford. It is a major issue affecting SEND provision in schools across the area.

Our MP said there had been a big increase in need as more and more students obtain EHCP (Education, Health and Care Plans) but there remains a significant shortfall in personnel at LSA and TA level. He also shared a number of personal stories sent in by constituents in a recent debate about children's mental health services which he said increasingly left parents in 'despair'.

Steve regularly visits schools across the constituency and is now able to resume in-person visits. If you would like him to pop into your school, touch today.

RENEWED NATURE RESERVE PUSH

An experienced councillor and energetic local campaigner have united to raise concerns over the protection of the green gap between Littleton and Harestock and repeat calls for a new nature reserve on nearby MoD land.

Liberal run Winchester City Council have two big decisions ahead of them in the area after they recently published their latest Strategic Housing and Economic Land Availability Assessment (SHELAA). One parcel of land put up for development by the plan is the green gap between Littleton and Harestock which Prospective City Councillor, **Andy Lai**, says "must be protected from development".

And as the Ministry of Defence prepare to depart the Sir John Moore Barracks site, council chiefs have still refused to back a growing campaign to create a new nature reserve on 25 hectares of green space on the Flowerdown site. Conservative **Councillor Patrick Cunningham**, pictured with Mr Lai, is among those backing the plan.

COUNTRYSIDE THREAT



Fresh concerns have been raised by local campaigners in south Winchester over a possible 'Royaldown lite' development being on the table.

The Winchester Post has heard from **David Killeen**, who organised the Save South Winchester group and will stand for council this Spring, that the threat of Royaldown is back along with smaller developments such as Pittvale Farm.

David (pictured with Steve Brine MP) says; "I am urging Winchester City Council to get a grip and take a stand against developers and build the right quality and quantity of housing in the right place. It is vital that consultation happens at every stage with local communities and parish councils."
