Brought Rishi Sunak to Winchester (pictured top) as part of the Conservative Leadership election tour.

AUGUST 2022 - Toured the set-up for Boomtown 2022 with festival organisers and continued my Summer Tour with street surgeries in the villages of Sparsholt, Micheldever and Old Alresford. Attended the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association conference in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

SEPTEMBER 2022 - Delivered a tribute to the Late Queen in the House of Commons and attended various events to mark her life and death as well as to proclaim the new King. Finished off fete season in Bighton and South Wonston and joined a new school 'cycle bus' from Colden Common and Twyford into Winchester. Visited Micheldever Primary School.

OCTOBER 2022 - Joined hundreds on the streets of Winchester for the annual mass cycle ride (pictured) and met a group of Ukrainian residents living in Colden Common. Visited Itchen Abbas Primary School, Colden Common Pre-School and welcomed a group of Scouts from Chandler's Ford to Westminster. Visited Winchester Hospital Day **Treatment Centre**

NOVEMBER 2022 - Began the month being elected as Chair of the powerful Health and Social Care Select Committee in the House of Commons. Marked Remembrance Sunday with events at Winchester Cathedral and The Kings' School. **Questioned Government** proposals to change childcare ratios and addressed students and staff at Winchester College. Took my daughter to watch Strictly live!

Announced the winner of my annual Christmas Card Competition and visited Ahmad Teas in Chandler's Ford. Spoke in important debates on NHS workforce and cancer and welcomed a lifting of the moratorium on new onshore wind. Demanded answers (pictured) about further power outages experienced by city centre businesses in Winchester.

JANUARY 2023 - Kicked off the new year with another visit to Winchester Hospital's **Emergency Department** (pictured) and held urgent meetings with Southern Water to hear explanations over Christmas water supply issues. Showed Itchen Abbas Primary School pupils around Westminster and popped in Sherborne House - in Hiltingbury - for their 90th anniversary celebrations.

FEBRUARY 2023 - Held my ASKtheAIRPORT public meeting with officials from Southampton Airport and visited Southern Water at Otterbourne. Led a key debate in Parliament on electric vehicles and opened a new surgical unit at Winchester Hospital. Visited the US with my new Select Committee.

MARCH 2023 - Spent a busy day dropping into Chandler's Ford's primary schools and broke ground at the new St Clements GP surgery in Winchester Received an update on the future of Sir John Moore Barracks and joined cancer campaigners in delivering a petition to Downing Street. APRIL 2023 - Welcomed the end of 'smart' motorways and honoured two local media legends at a Downing Street reception. Pressed the Government over continued inaction on the Infected Blood scandal and visited Winchester City Mill as a new campaign was launched to replace the ancient mill.

MAY 2023 - Met King Charles in Parliament (pictured) days before his Coronation and ioined constituents from across Winchester and Chandler's Ford to celebrate the joyous occasion. Met with Winchester City Council to hear of the (latest) plans to regenerate

ELECTRIC VEHICLES

The Government have announced the sale of new petrol and diesel cars will be phased out by 2030 so I held a debate in the Commons to investigate whether we are on track. It focused on the cost and availability of new EVs and charging infrastructure.

EARLY YEARS

This year I've continued my chairmanship of the All-Party Group for Childcare and Early Education. Throughout this Parliament I've been clear that early years must be a priority for the Government to ensure every child gets the best start to life. New funding announced in the Budget was very welcome but we've a lot more work to do.



NHS DENTISTRY

I've been clear since becoming Chair of the Health Committee that access to NHS dentistry is one of our top priorities. I recently spoke in a main Commons debate on the urgency of dental contract reform and the challenge Ministers now face getting dentists to return to NHS work.

HIV & AIDS

My longstanding commitment, which started when I was Public Health Minister, to tackling HIV and AIDS has continued this year and I remain as a Co-Chair of the All-Party group. Through our work we seek to ensure all people living with HIV can access affordable medicines and a decent quality of life, free from stigma and to ending new infections by 2030.

SCHOOL MEALS

Headteachers across Winchester and Chandler's Ford have raised with me the pressures their budgets face from what is supposed to be universal free school meals for infant age children. I led a debate in the House on the subject and have asked Ministers to fill the gap between funding and cost that is hurting some school budgets.
